Study UK

- Launched in current form in 2016, Study UK is the only national-level campaign that promotes the UK as a first-choice study destination all over the world.
- Delivered by the British Council in partnership with the UK government's GREAT Britain campaign, which encourages people to visit, invest, and study in the UK.





1. Explore possibilites

Students at this stage are:

- considering studying abroad (UK vs. other countries)
- looking for inspiration
- seeking evidence of why the UK is the best choice for their future.

Study UK runs:

- awareness and consideration campaigns ('I'm on my way')
- content that profiles key pull factors of the UK (employability, academic excellence and student experience)
- 'Why study in the UK?' webinars and events
- participation in education fairs and exhibitions
- free taster courses from a range of UK HEIs.



2. Filter and finalise

Students at this stage are:

- exploring the practicalities of studying in the UK
- looking for information on courses
- seeking practical guidance about application processes and the cost of studying.

Study UK runs:

- a suite of content about subjects you can study in the UK
- information across digital channels about universities, courses, costs, scholarships etc.
- the GREAT Scholarships campaign.

3. Apply and accept

Students at this stage are:

- applying to their chosen institutions
- looking for support in navigating the application process, scholarship applications, writing personal statements etc.

Study UK directs students to HEIs for this stage, but also provides a suite of video and written content about HEI and scholarship applications.




4. Prepare to live

- seeking reassurance about travelling to the UK, settling in and navigating their first week.


Study UK runs:

Study options

A variety of study options

UK universities have one of the most diverse subject offerings in the world.

Undergraduate courses include:

- bachelor's or undergraduate degrees (full-time)
- · bachelor's or undergraduate degrees (part-time)
- shorter courses such as a foundation degree, Diploma of Higher Education, Higher National Diploma, and Certificate of Higher Education.

Postgraduate courses include:

- master's degrees
- MBA courses
- · PhDs or doctorates
- postgraduate diplomas and qualifications (these are usually shorter than a master's and do not involve a thesis or dissertation)
- professional and vocational qualifications.



Choosing a location



In the UK, there are over 160 higher education institutions to choose from, and they can be found in every location.

Here are some of the things to consider when choosing where to study in the UK:

- In a city, or somewhere quieter and more remote?
- Extra-curricular passion that would suit a certain location?
- Family or friends in the UK nearby?
- Cost of living in big cities?
- Preference for studying in England, Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland?

Types of universities

Traditional universities

- Often the largest and have the longest histories.
- · Located in cities.
- May have higher entry tariffs.
- Global reputations for research, with many of the prestigious 'Russell Group' universities falling into this category.



Metropolitan universities



- · Based in cities.
- Shorter histories than accompanying traditional universities.
- Wider variety of courses on offer.
- Lower entry tariffs (although this will depend on the university and course).

Campus universities

- Facilities that are all self-contained (lecture halls, accommodation, shops, libraries, laboratories).
- Located on the outskirts of cities or in smaller towns (although there are plenty of campus universities in cities, too).
- Feel safe and part of a community.



Specialist universities



- Focus on a particular subject area, such as science, law, agriculture, music, dance or drama.
- Some are known as 'conservatoires'.
- Examples include the University of Law, the Royal Agricultural University, the Royal College of Music and the Royal College of Speech and Drama.




Providing support
