
















WHY CHOOSE THE UK?

The United Kingdom (UK) consists of England, Wales, Scotland (which together make up Great Britain) and Northern Ireland. The capital city of the UK is London, which is also the capital of England.

WHAT IS SUMMER SCHOOL?

Provided by universities and international colleges in the UK, summer school programs offer short academic and non-academic courses, usually lasting from one to eight weeks.

They usually take place during summer and offer students the opportunity to engage with a subject of their choice, combining study with other related activities.

There's a wide variety of subjects to choose from, such as Interior Design or Climate Change. Whether you want to focus on a subject or discover a new interest, the UK has a course for you to choose.

These programs vary in length and can be found throughout the UK. Some of them offer credit-bearing courses that can help you to earn credits towards your degree in the US.

Summer school programs give you the opportunity to travel, have fun and immerse yourself in a different culture, all while learning a subject of your interest.

Some of the benefits of enrolling in a summer school in the UK are:

Improve your grades and outcomes

This is a more exciting way to get extra hours of study that can help you boost your grades and try other learning methods that can change your approach to learning.

It will also prove that you have a high level of commitment to your own development.



Some summer schools also offer researchoriented programs where you can participate in a professional research environment under faculty supervision; a very valuable experience if you're planning your own future research.

This is your chance to explore your passions and enhance your skills in the company of other students that share your interests. There are plenty of options for you to expand your expertise or try out new study opportunities.

HOW TO APPLY

When you are ready to apply, there are some key details that you should consider.

1. Determine which course is for you

It should meet your interests and expectations. Check program details online and don't be afraid to ask questions to the program organizer.

2. Application period commonly starts between April and May.

Most places are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis, so we encourage you to apply early.

3. Double-check entry requirements.

Most common include age, educational level and language requirements. There are usually two ways to apply: as an individual or through your university abroad advisor.

- When you apply as an individual, you're expected to complete an application form, gather your documents, arrange accommodation and pay your fees.
- If applying through your study abroad advisor, you should follow their instructions.

IMPORTANT

Some institutions hold partnerships with US universities that will make your application process easier, we encourage you to consult your study abroad advisor first.

4. Earning academic credits.

If you're interested in earning academic credits, it's your responsibility to discuss credit transfer with your advisor before starting your application, as arrangements can vary.

5. Confirm accommodation.

Some programs include accommodation (on and off-campus); others need to be arranged separately. Accommodation is usually limited and needs to be reserved in advance.

VISAS

US Students doing a short course of study in the UK (for 6 months or less) do not need a visa to come to the UK.

US students doing a short course of study in the UK (for 6 months or less) do not need a visa to come to the UK. You must go to a border control officer when you arrive in the UK to get a stamp on your passport. This will allow you to study in the UK - do not use the ePassport gates.

- Proof that you have been accepted on a course by an accredited institution or by a UK Higher Education Institution, for example, a letter of acceptance.
- Proof that you can fund your stay in the UK and return journey.
- Proof that you intend to leave the UK at the end of your course.

If you're travelling without your parent or guardian, you can check additional requirements here: www.gov.uk/study-visit-visa/documents-you-must-provide

- Details of where you intend to stay.
 If you're under 18 years old, you'll also need:
- Contact details for at least one parent or guardian in your home country.

Remember that you must always have these documents when you're travelling in and out of the UK during your stay.

PRE-DEPARTURE

Being well prepared for your journey makes life a lot easier.

Make sure you have got everything organized with plenty of time to spare before you leave home. Read everything your advisor and your place of study have sent you carefully.

You should also have been provided with a 24-hour telephone number and the name of someone as an emergency contact.

You should plan your journey from your point of entry into the UK to your final destination and know when and where you are supposed to arrive.

Many institutions offer a 'meet and greet' airport collection service for your arrival in the UK. If you want to use this service, you will need to book it in advance. This is a part of the institution's overall welcome and helps international students settle into life in the UK.

Some things to keep in your hand luggage are:

- A valid passport with a visa or UK entry clearance (if applicable).
- · Airplane tickets.
- A letter of acceptance from your place of study. This must be a paper copy (not an electronic copy on a tablet or phone).
- Documentary evidence that you have enough money to pay your tuition fees and accommodate yourself while you're in the UK (recent bank statements, proof of scholarship, or sponsor's letter).
- Some British currency.
- Any prescribed drugs or medicine you are taking, plus a letter from your doctor explaining what they are.
- An address, telephone number, and travel instructions to your final destination.

Money

You need to bring enough money (British currency or Pound sterling £) to cover your immediate needs on your arrival in the UK, including customs charges, transportation fares and any emergency expenses.

Insurance

You should also take out travel and medical insurance for the duration of your stay.

Visiting Europe while in the UK

If you are planning to visit Europe either on holiday or on a course field trip while you are studying, we recommend that you check if citizens from your country are required to have a visa to enter the EU.

Luggage

You should have enough warm clothing for your flight and subsequent journey. Several layers of lightweight clothes are better than a single shirt or dress.

Only essential personal possessions may be brought. You may be charged for excess baggage if you exceed the baggage allowance, so check with the airline before you leave. When you are packing your suitcase, you should be aware that some food, plant, and medicines are made from endangered species and are not allowed through UK customs.

ACCOMMODATION

It's always best to arrange accommodation in the UK before you leave home.

Think carefully about your needs. For example, how close is the accommodation to your place of study? Is there good public transport? How much will it cost? Are you near shops and facilities? How secure is it? Your place of study should be able to advise you on all of this.

To have the best chance of securing accommodation, you must:

- Apply as soon as you can.
- Fully complete any forms and return them before the deadline date.
- Confirm your accommodation arrangements before you arrive in the UK.
- Be prepared to have to pay for accommodation in advance, if necessary.

University/college accommodation

Most universities and colleges have their own accommodation office, and this should be the first place you go to ask about accommodation.

Most institutions provide accommodation for students in a hall of residence (either fullboard or self-catering) or a self-catering shared house or flat.

Space is usually limited, so applications for such accommodation should be made as soon as you have been accepted on your course and certainly before the required deadline.

Private accommodation

The accommodation office at your institution may be able to help with this too. The office may keep lists of private accommodation available in the area, and some offices may even help you arrange a booking.

The most usual type of private accommodation is a room in a house, sharing facilities. Renting a furnished house or a flat is likely to be expensive, especially in city centres, and quite difficult to find.

A good way of making this affordable is to share with other students. If you do this, make sure you agree beforehand on how you will share costs.

Checklist for Students:

- Do you know exactly when and where you are supposed to arrive?
- Have you planned your journey to your final destination?
- Have you informed your place of study when you are likely to arrive?
- Have you checked if you are able to book an airport collection, and have you booked it?
- Have you received information on how to get to your place of study from the airport?
- Do you have an emergency contact number in case you have problems on your journey?

ARRIVAL IN THE UK

Most international students travel by air and your first sight of the UK is likely to be an airport.

If you are travelling by air you will usually arrive at Gatwick, Heathrow, London City, Luton or Stansted airports, all of which are convenient if you are studying in London or the south-east of England.

If you are studying elsewhere, there are many international, regional airports located throughout the UK, and your journey is likely to be much easier if you fly to the regional airport closest to your place of study.

Many intercontinental flights now serve UK airports such as Birmingham, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Manchester; direct and onward connections are available from these, as well as from the London airports to destinations throughout the UK.

There are also excellent connections to UK regional airports through European airports such as Amsterdam, Paris, or Frankfurt.

If you pass through another European airport check beforehand whether you require a 'transit visa', which will normally give you a fixed number of hours or days after arrival in which to complete your onward journey.

If your air journey involves a connection, whether in Europe or in the UK, ask the airline staff to check you and your baggage through to your final destination, as this will make your transit through the connection airport much easier.

These are the steps you must take:

- Follow the sign for 'Arrivals' unless you are transferring to another plane at the same airport. If you are transferring to another plane, follow the 'Flight connections' sign and any further instructions.
- 'Arrivals' will take you to passport control.
- As you approach passport control, you will see electronic screens; these will show you which zone you will need to go through. Make sure you join the right queue.
- All passengers must go through the immigration zone dealing with their flight.
- The immigration officer will want to see: that your passport is up to date, that your documents are in order, your landing card from the plane, and, if required, a valid visa.
- The immigration officer needs to be satisfied that you meet the immigration rules for students and that you intend to leave the UK at the end of your studies.
- As long as your documents are in order, you should pass through immigration smoothly. But if you find you need any help for any reason, you can ask the immigration officer to telephone your place of study (keep the telephone number with you).



Once you are clear of passport control you can proceed to the baggage reclaim area, where you can collect your luggage. When you have come through customs, you will have completed all the formalities and will have officially arrived in the UK.

Climate and clothing

The UK has a temperate climate, with few extremes. But the weather here is famously changeable, so be prepared. It can be quite wet and cold in the winter (roughly November to March). A warm topcoat, hat, scarf, gloves and an umbrella are a good idea. It also gets dark early. Summers can occasionally be showery and overcast but are mostly pleasant and rarely extremely hot. The days are long, and it stays light until late in the evening.

Travelling around

Once you have established your study routine, you may want to take a break from your studies and travel beyond the town or city where you are living. Your time in the UK would be incomplete without spending some of that time enjoying what the country has to offer. The cheapest way to travel is by coach – trains are more comfortable, and a lot quicker, but more expensive.

Religion

Places of worship in most major cities and towns include Hindu and Buddhist temples, mosques, and synagogues. Today there are few places, other than remote areas, where the religious needs of people from other countries are not met.

Disabled students

UK institutions are legally required not to discriminate against disabled students, and not to treat them less favorably than students without a disability.

Institutions are also required to adjust services for disabled students so that they are not disadvantaged in comparison with other students. These laws apply to international students as well as to students who are UK citizens. We encourage students to disclose any disabilities to your program organizers so that they can ensure that accommodations can be made.

Creating a Safe Environment

All UK universities are working hard and following government guidance to ensure the health and well-being of international students during Covid-19 pandemic. Information and guidance will vary across England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales.
