What makes a successful creative portfolio?

Deciding what to include (and what to lose) in an art and design portfolio can be tough. Follow our top tips to help you organize your work and create a portfolio that will stand out from the crowd. Your portfolio should show three key things:

Your inspiration, your technical ability and your ideas development.

It's important to document the development of your ideas from start to finish. Including images from your sketchbooks or photographs is a great way to do this.

We want to see your passion for the subject you are applying for. That means you should make sure the work you include is relevant to the course you want to do.

Even if you haven't studied the subject at school, including work from outside class shows your passion for the subject and that you are not afraid to experiment.

Don't forget the basics – some key considerations should be:

- Layout keep it simple.
 Think about the order in which you want your work to be seen.
- Don't distract from the work itself labelling should be minimal.
- Photography make sure you photograph your work in good lighting and use high-quality images.
- Quality over quantity your portfolio should reflect your best work. Avoid repeating similar images, so you have more chance to include a range of styles.

Moving to the UK: Tips and Hacks

UK universities are a great option for US students who want to specialize early in their chosen major, gain their undergrad or master's degree more quickly at a lower cost, and explore the UK, Ireland, and Europe while doing so.

There are four UK nations: England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.

The first three make up mainland Great Britain, and Northern Ireland is geographically based on the island of Ireland, but politically and economically part of the UK.

UK undergraduate degrees normally take three years (except Scotland), while taught master's programs take just one year, rather than two in the US. It's possible to graduate from a UK university with both an undergrad and master's within four years.

It's usually cheaper for a US student to study in the UK than at a public, out of state college or a private college in the US.

UK university education is focused on DEPTH rather than BREADTH of knowledge: this means there's no General Ed, and master's students don't have to take the GRE.

Most students have their own private room, and student experience is enhanced by active Student Unions and the close proximity of Europe for travel!

Most US students will need a visa, and a one-off annual fee gives you full access to the UK National Health Service for medical treatment during your studies

What's a personal statement?

The personal statement is a short essay to explain why you are a great candidate for the course and the university and forms an important part of your application alongside your grades.

Your personal statement will be read by admissions tutors deciding whether are a good 'fit' for the course and the institution and allows you to explain in your own words exactly why you want to study the course, your long standing passion for the subject area and your long term career goals.

A list of impressive grades is a great start – but your personal statement is your opportunity to set yourself apart from the other candidates.

Make it easy by breaking it down – a strong introduction, followed by an overview of your academic achievements and any relevant work experience, then explain your hobbies, interests and extracurricular activities before finally making a strong finish!

Differences between conservatoire and university study?

What is a 'conservatoire'? And what are the main differences between pursuing a performing arts degree at a UK university compared to a conservatoire? Here are top tips compiled by leva Lakute from the International Relations Office at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music & Dance.

What is a conservatoire?

A conservatoire is a higher education institution that specializes in training performance artists. Teaching is generally less academic and much more vocational, with plenty of performance opportunities and

1:1 Teaching

Compared to universities, conservatoires focus on 1:1 teaching, led by expert staff who are still very active in their field. Professional musicians and other performers often teach at several conservatoires, as part of their 'portfolio career'.

Performance Opportunities

Performance is an integral part of training at a conservatoire. Throughout the year, students typically undertake a range of performance opportunities, including solo performances, festivals, competitions, collaborative group projects, chamber music, and orchestral projects. Conservatoires provide students with practice rooms, performance spaces and links with the wider industry.

Close-knit Community

Compared to most universities, conservatoires tend to have a smaller cohor of students. For example, at Trinity Laban there are roughly 1,200 students studying across Music, Dance or Musical Theatre.

This helps to form a close-knit community between staff, students and alumni, fostering collaboration and connections, as well as friendships that last well beyond graduation and see students through into the professional world.

UCAS vs. Common App - Which one should I use?

Jackie Christopher from Falmouth University will be explaining the three application systems: what you need to know before applying and which one is best suited for you.

Comparing the two main centralized UK/US applications systems, UCAS and Common App, UCAS lists all UK universities and colleges, however you can only apply up to 5 choices. Common App only has 23 UK universities listed on their system but allows you to apply to many UK and US universities.

With most UK direct applications, depending on the university, they will advise to apply directly only if you know they are your first choice. However, there are some universities that will allow you to apply through their own online application in addition to other universities through UCAS. It's important to check before applying on what their policy is.

If you only want to apply to one or two universities in the UK with US universities, then CommonApp might be your best option.

If you are more interested in studying in the UK with a broader selection of choices, it's best to apply through UCAS and/or through Direct App's.

Whatever you choose to do, just make sure you only accept one UK university. All information is transmitted through UCAS and you could risk losing all offers if accepting to more than one.



Falmouth University is listed on UCAS and has their own free online direct application system. Students applying should be aware of which system is best to use before starting the application if they are applying to one or more UK universities.

Prepare your audition for Creative Arts and Performance Courses

Maggie Tarver, Course Leader for Acting and Performance at Solent University delivers an Auditions Masterclass explaining what makes an audition piece stand out from the competition and everything you need to know to ensure yours does!

When submitting an Audition there are some top tips below you should consider:

Showcase attitude: Universities are looking for students who display a willingness to learn, develop and take some risks within themselves to make themselves stand out.

Demonstrate potential: This could be in acting ability, or for courses such as Musical Theatre singing as well but we are not looking for perfection in this. Universities are looking for someone we can teach, train and develop.

Prepare beforehand: Read what will be expected of you at the audition; for example, for Acting and Performance you will be asked to audition two pieces- one contemporary and the other classical.

Study those monologues prior to delivering them at your audition and be sure that they contrast so that you are showing your best range and choose pieces that best show off the breadth and depth your skills and abilities.

Be confident and believe in your abilities (enjoy it!): spend time familiarising yourself with your audition and feel proud of it. Believe in yourself and your potential will shine through.

Persevere if you do make a mistake: Making an error or a mistake is not the end of the world, so if your audition is live please don't panic if something goes wrong. Take a second to gather yourself and continue, it will show us you can deal with the pressure of things sometimes going wrong!
